



ELIGIBILITY VERIFICATION OF MIGRANT OR SEASONAL FARMWORKER

In order to be eligible for services provided by the High School Equivalency Program (HEP) under the guidelines established by the U.S. Department of Education, a student or his/her parent (s) or legal guardian(s) must have worked at least 75 days within the last two years in agriculture as a migrant or seasonal farmworker. This includes any activity directly related to the production of crops, dairy products, poultry, livestock, cultivation or harvesting of trees, ranching, fishery, cannery, nursery, and forestry work.

OR

Be eligible to participate, or have participated within the past two years, in programs under Subpart 1 of Chapter 1 of Title 1 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, or WIA of 1998 program.
